HUMANS TO THE RED PLANET WITHIN A DECADE Robert Zubrin

President, The Mars Society

Mars Direct is a proposal for a relatively low-cost manned mission to Mars with current rocket technology. The plan was originally detailed in a research paper by Robert Zubrin and David Baker in 1990. The mission was expanded upon in Zubrin's 1996 book *The Case For Mars*. Mars Direct has attracted international attention and broad controversy. Now, with the revival of the call for a human space exploration initiative, the Mars Direct plan is at the center of the debate: Can Americans reach the Red Planet in our time? Are humans more useful than robots in space? Can we afford to do this? Can we afford *not* to?

EVERYONE IS WELCOME. The discussion starts at 6:30 in the Mercantile Room (no food service there). Come before 6 PM to leave yourself time to get something to eat, or stay and eat afterwards. We end around 8 PM.
